BORROW THE INTERNET: KAJEET SMARTSPOT LENDING PROGRAM

The Beaufort County Library is partnering with Beaufort County, Beaufort County School District, Verizon Wireless and Kajeet to expand the reach and benefits of free access to the internet to underserved youth and communities by introducing a pilot WiFi SmartSpot Program, which will enable them to borrow a mobile WiFi SmartSpot device for free from the Library for a sustained period of time. Mobile WiFi SmartSpot devices use cellular networks to create a personal broadband internet hotspot and provide portable, high-speed internet connectivity that can be shared between multiple users.

This initiative will help to bridge a major gap in the availability of the internet for a critical segment of Beaufort County's population which has the most to gain from its use. The pilot WiFi SmartSpot Program will provide quality access and allow users to continue to learn, work, explore, and create beyond library and school hours.

This initiative will allow 10 students living in Beaufort County to freely borrow a mobile WiFi SmartSpot device for a one month loan period. Students will be selected through an application process and recommendation from Beaufort County School District.

Training in the use of WiFi devices is mandatory for those selected. In addition to the students, training will be extended to their parents /caregivers to enable them to provide support and augment their own digital literacy skills.

We will analyze the purpose and hours of use, as well as the number of household users. We will also track usage of scholastic and library resources, and use surveys to determine user awareness of educational programs, user satisfaction, and increased technology skills, such as confidence in using the internet and enhanced understanding of the internet.

At the conclusion of the pilot year, the program may be expanded with the following goals in mind:

- Goal 1: Increase household access to at home broadband internet
- Goal 2: Raise digital exposure and confidence
- Goal 3: Increase engagement with library and school learning resources
- Goal 4: Establish a scalable public library model for tackling the national digital divide

WIFI SMARTSPOT PROGRAM TERMS OF USE

WHO CAN BORROW (all criteria must be met):

- Beaufort County public school students grades 6 12.
- Must attend school in Beaufort County.
- Must reside in a household without broadband internet access.
- Possess a Beaufort County Library card in good standing (less than \$10 in fines).
- Agee to participate in surveys and other outcome based evaluations.

ELIGIBILTY: Borrowers will be determined through an application process and Beaufort County School District recommendations. Students and parents/caregivers must attend an orientation/training session.

USER AGREEMENT: Must be signed by a parent or caregiver.

BORROWING LIMIT: 1 device per household.

• **CONTENT**: Users must agree to the SmartSpot Terms of Use

SERVICE COVERAGE: Available anywhere with Verizon cell phone coverage area.

USAGE FEE: Free. (3G or 4G/LTE connection)

CIRCULATION: Borrow for one month increments (must renew once a month by completing an online survey).

OVERDUE FEE: \$1/DAY. Overdue devices will be deactivated.

REPLACEMENT FEE: Lost or damaged device - \$139.99

SUPPORT: Beaufort County Library Information Technology Staff.

RECHARGE DEVICE: Fully recharge device before returning it.

RETURN DEVICE: To the local branch library (Beaufort, Bluffton, Hilton Head, Lobeco, St. Helena)
